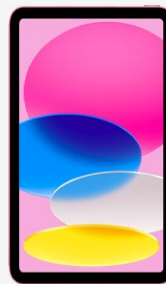





Symbol	Gesture
	Tap. Briefly touch an item on the screen with one finger. For example, to open an app, tap its icon on the Home Screen.
	Touch and hold. Press an item on the screen until something happens. For example, if you touch and hold the wallpaper of the Home Screen, the app icons begin to jiggle.
	Swipe. Move one finger across the screen quickly. For example, swipe left on the Home Screen to see more apps.
	Scroll. Move one finger across the screen without lifting. For example, in Photos, you can drag a list up or down to see more. Swipe to scroll quickly; touch the screen to stop scrolling.
	<p>Zoom. Place two fingers on the screen near each other. Spread them apart to zoom in, or move them toward each other to zoom out.</p> <p>You can also double-tap a photo or webpage to zoom in, and double-tap again to zoom out. In Maps, double-tap and hold, then drag up to zoom in or drag down to zoom out.</p>

	Go Home. Swipe up from the bottom edge of the screen to return to the Home Screen at any time. See Open apps on iPad .
	Quickly access controls. Swipe down from the top-right corner to open Control Center; touch and hold a control to reveal more options. To add or remove controls, go to Settings  > Control Center. See Use and customize Control Center on iPad .



Open the App Switcher. Swipe up from the bottom edge, pause in the center of the screen, then lift your finger. To browse the open apps, swipe right, then tap the app you want to use. See [Switch between apps on iPad](#).



Switch between open apps. Swipe left or right along the bottom edge of the screen to quickly switch between open apps. (On an iPad with a Home button, swipe with a slight arc.) See [Switch between apps on iPad](#).



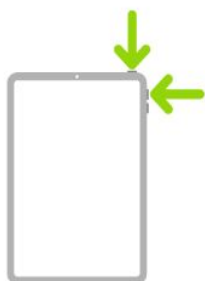
Open the Dock within an app. Swipe up from the bottom edge of the screen and pause to reveal the Dock. To quickly open another app, tap it in the Dock. See [Open an app from the Dock](#).



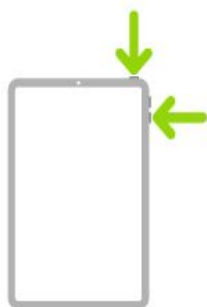
Use Siri. Just say "Siri" or "Hey Siri." Or press and hold the top button while you make your request. (On an iPad with a Home button, press and hold the Home button while you make a request.) Then release the button. See [Use Siri on iPad](#).




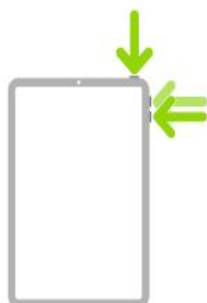
Use Accessibility Shortcut. Triple-click the top button. (On an iPad with a Home button, triple-click the Home button.) See [Quickly turn accessibility features on or off on iPad](#).



Take a screenshot. Simultaneously press and quickly release the top button and either volume button. (On an iPad with a Home button, simultaneously press and quickly release the top button and the Home button.) See [Take a screenshot on iPad](#).



Turn off. Simultaneously press and hold the top button and either volume button until the sliders appear, then drag the top slider to power off. (On an iPad with a Home button, press and hold the top button until the sliders appear.) Or go to Settings  > General > Shut Down. See [Turn iPad on or off \(models with the Home button\)](#).



Force restart. Press and quickly release the volume button nearest the top button, press and quickly release the other volume button, then press and hold the top button until the Apple logo appears. On iPad mini (6th generation) and iPad mini (A17 Pro), the volume buttons are at the top left. See [Force restart iPad](#).

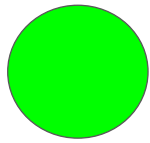

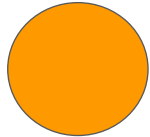

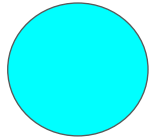

App Store **approved**, user **beware**

While Apple vets apps for initial safety, their behavior after download can still be malicious.

Data Access and Privacy:

Apps often request access to your personal information, such as contacts, location data, and calendar entries. It's crucial to review the permissions an app requests and only grant access to what you deem necessary.

Oversharing of Data:

Apps may collect and share your data with third parties, including data brokers, for advertising or other purposes.

App Tracking Transparency:

Be aware of [App Tracking Transparency](#) on iOS, which allows you to choose whether an app can track your activity across other companies' apps and websites.



Here are some steps you can take to protect yourself:

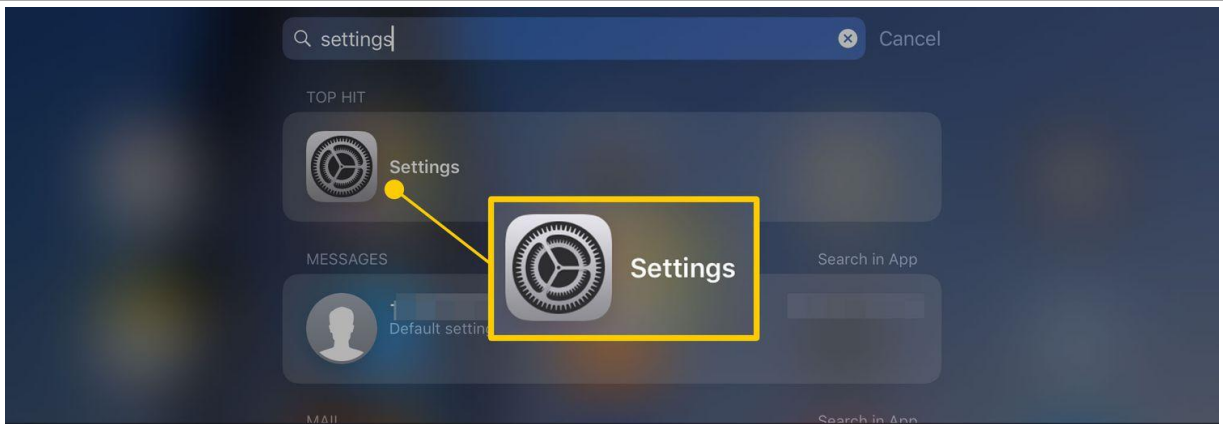
Review Permissions: Before installing an app, carefully review the permissions it requests. Ensure that these permissions are relevant to the app's functionality. For example, a simple calculator app should not need access to your contacts or location.

Use a strong password: Use a strong password for your device and your app accounts.

Be cautious of suspicious links: Avoid tapping on suspicious links or pop-ups.

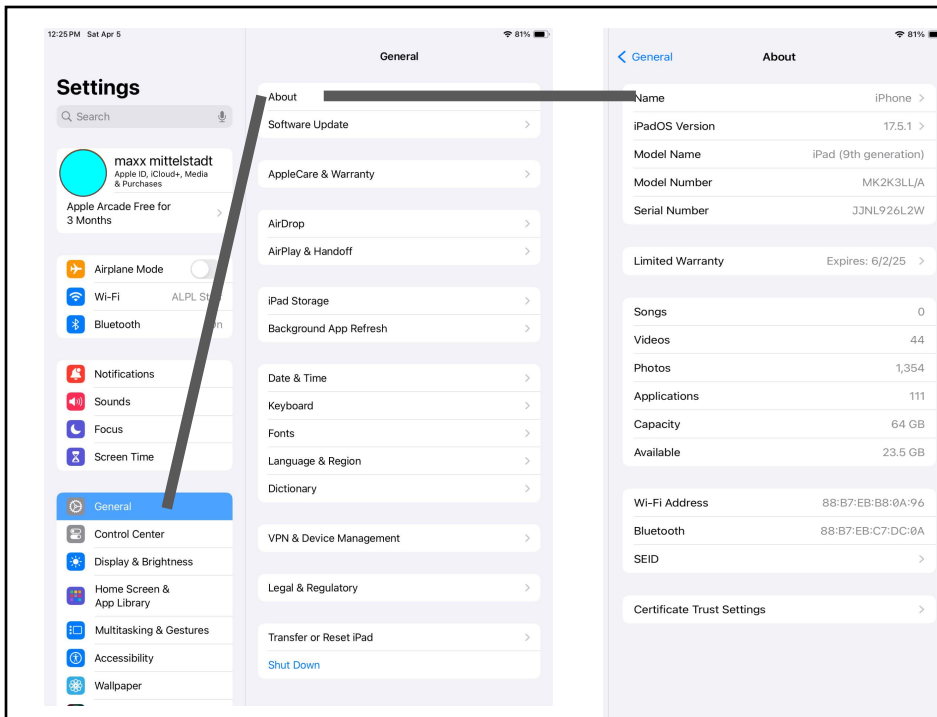
Be Wary of Suspicious Activity: If an app starts behaving in an unexpected or suspicious way, consider deleting it.

Read Privacy Policies: Take the time to read the privacy policy of apps you intend to use to understand how they collect, use, and share your data.



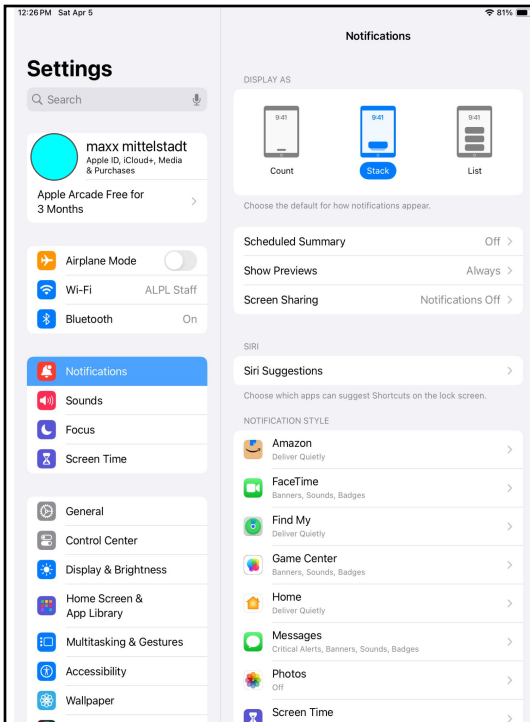

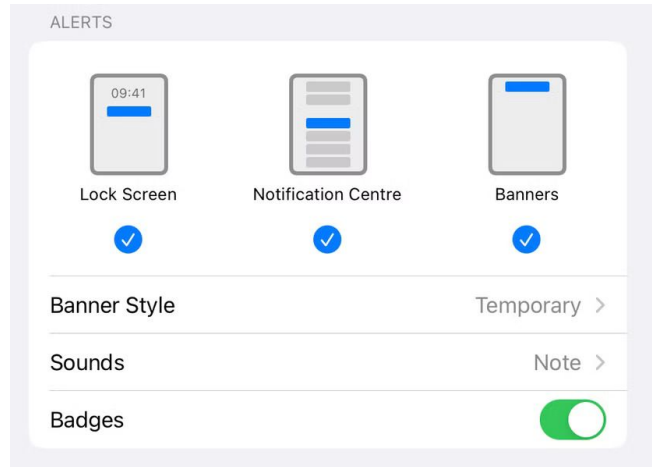

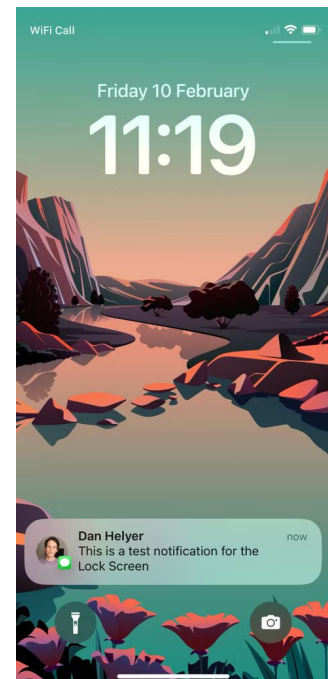
Notifications and Alerts



Lock Screen Alerts:

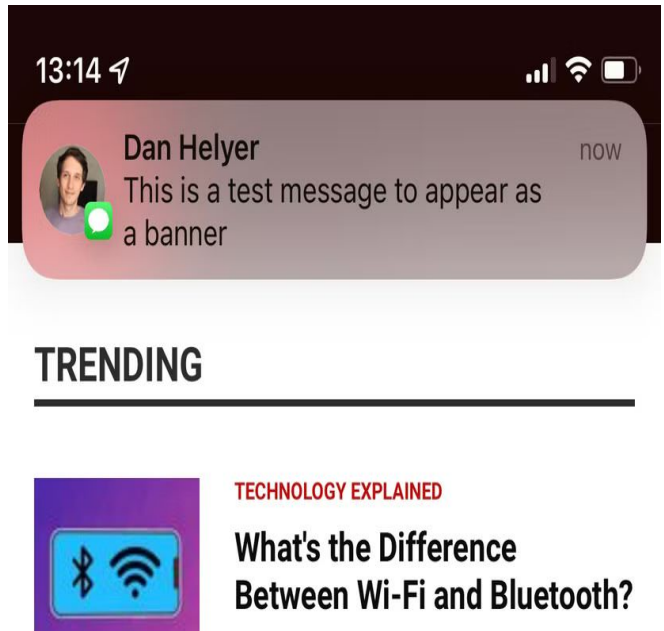
The **Lock Screen** option if you want notifications to appear on the Lock Screen of your device. This is the screen with the time on it that shows up when you wake up your iPhone or iPad but don't unlock it.

The benefit of a Lock Screen notification is that you'll immediately notice it any time you pick up your iPhone or iPad. The downside to a Lock Screen notification is that anyone else can see these notifications as well, since they show up without you needing to unlock your device. Luckily, you can get around most privacy issues this causes by [hiding preview content in notifications](#).



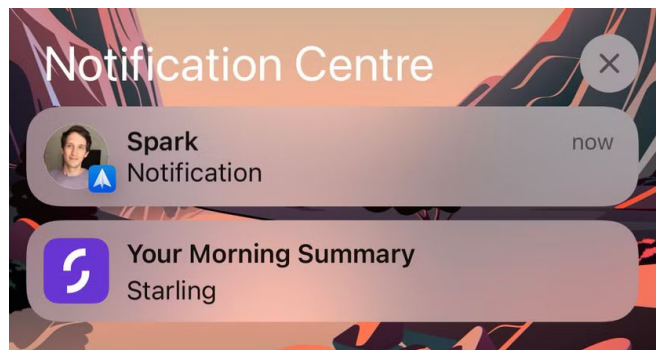
Banner Alerts:

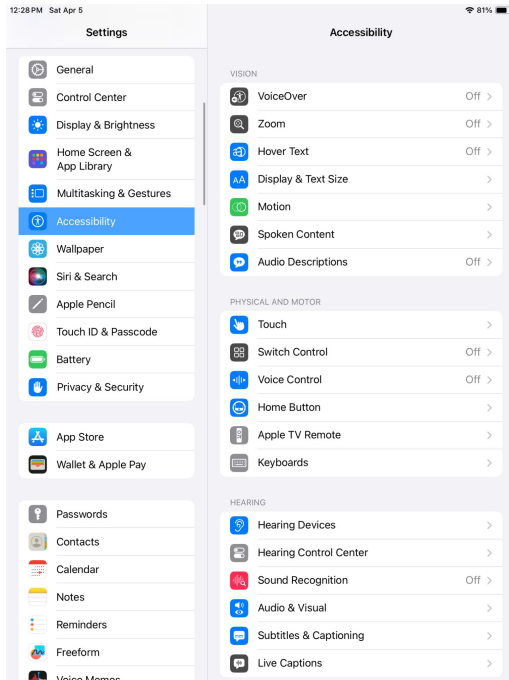
The notifications that appear at the top of your screen while you're using another app on your iPhone or iPad. You see them most often with instant messaging apps, but they can be used for any kind of notification. Banners often let you interact with the app through the notification as well, like typing out a WhatsApp reply.



Notification Center Alerts:

You can view the Notification Center by swiping up from the Lock Screen or swiping down from the top of the screen after unlocking your device. This will show a list of various notifications, grouped by app, time, and date. It's great for sorting through lots of notifications when you've got a little more time.

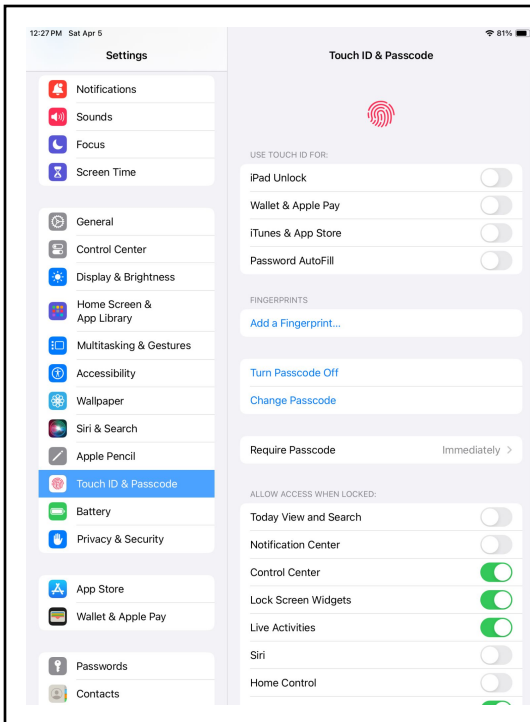
